Dear Friends,

Last Wednesday morning, I drove over to the Darlington Presbyterian Church for a visitation and funeral service for Mrs. Finley Lucas James, wife of Albert James, III. Many years ago, when Albert had completed his military service in 1970, he and Finley returned to his home in Darlington. As often happens in churches, this young couple was then invited to lead our youth ministry on Sunday evenings. I was in high school at the time. I can remember many occasions when we met in people's homes for our youth program on Sunday nights. Albert and Finley gave caring, thoughtful and incisive leadership to us when we were teenaged youth. They listened and encouraged more than they directed or judged. Later, when I was home in Darlington from college or seminary, they were further encouragers for me as I prepared for the ordained ministry. So, I was sure to attend Finley's service last Wednesday morning, along with about three hundred other people. After the service, I spoke to Graham Segars, Finley's daughter. I told Graham of her mother's positive influence on me. (Graham and her husband, David Segars, are member of First Church, Hartsville, so I was their pastor for over seven years.)

Since Wednesday morning, I have been thinking about those people, like Finley and Albert, who influence us. All these fifty years later, I can remember specific situations where they were helpful to me in my faith development, and the questions that all teenagers ask. It is a lot like my 50th high school reunion, which I attended Saturday night, July 29. We may have looked as bored as teenagers could look in those high school classes long ago. Yet, we now value highly those teachers who tried so hard to get some useful information into our thick heads.

I say all this because we are on the verge of another critical year for our children and youth in our church. From Mother's Morning Out to Sunday evening youth, from children's choir with Weiz Baker and bells with Lindsay Bennett, thru Sunday School and Wednesdays of Fun Program, we try to fulfill our baptism vows. We try to nurture, that is, grow faith in all our children. That faith is the content of what we believe as Presbyterian Christians as well as the character of Jesus Christ that we hope to duplicate in our children. Everyone is asked to share in these children, youth and family ministries! Everyone is asked to support our next installed pastor and Coordinator of Youth Ministries, whenever those persons are called! Everyone is asked to participate more in Sunday School and chancel choir as a new school year begins!

Who can you influence to believe? Who knows, fifty years from now, who will remember you? Will you be remembered by present-day children and youth for your faith and service to Jesus Christ, as I remember Finley James? We have opportunities now to have a very positive influence on the younger generation. I hope we will make the most of every opportunity to grow faith in Jesus Christ!



It helps with blood pressure, reduces stress, improves symptoms of lung and heart problems, alleviates anxiety, and helps with depression. Music is powerful! Physiological studies of music have long been explored. It can make you happy, move you to tears, and take you beyond what this world has to offer. Music is bonding! Once you sing together on a regular basis, you never forget a particular service or performance you did together. It brings togetherness. Music keeps you young! It helps with memorization and keeps your brain young. By learning lyrics, pitches, and rhythmic values, it forces your brain to work extra and exercises your memory skills. Music keeps you alive! It can increase your life expectancy! The church sanctuary now has a hearing loop installed. This is a system that sends the audio captured on the microphones directly into a hearing aid worn by anyone in the congregation. The system provides the cleanest, clearest sound imaginable for hearing aid wearers and does not require a headset, as it works with any hearing aid that has a T-coil. We also have a limited supply of loop receivers and headsets that can be used during worship if your hearing aid is not equipped with a t-coil. For assistance during worship, feel free to ask an usher.

If you wear a hearing aid and are unsure if it is equipped with a T-coil, please consult with your audiologist.
